The Trampoline world was brought to a standstill early in April when we heard of the death of George Nissen, at the age of 96 who, was the inventor of the forerunner to today's trampolines. With the FIG World Cup 2010 series now underway it will be interesting to see if there will be any changes at the top of the table at the end of the year, or will we still have the same gymnasts competing for the final places in Salzgitter GER in October; and will any of the GBR team members make inroads to the top ranks. The season ahead, culminating in the World Championships, will be really interesting. To remind you of the table standing for the 2010 season you will find results elsewhere in this Newsletter.

Volcanic ash from Iceland played a major role in the disruption of travel arrangements for the GB team heading to Varna for the European Championships, with the delegation having to hire two coaches to make the 57 hour journey overland, minus the DMT Team Manager who was unable to make the departure point in London on a six hour notice of departure. The excellent results, plus a full report on the journey can be found elsewhere in this Newsletter.

If you are not already aware, London 2012 have signed-up GYMNOVA as the official gymnastics equipment supplier for the Games and they will provide all the equipment needed for the gymnastics events at London 2012. The Great Britain Trampoline Team will get their first opportunity to use the new GYMNOVA trampolines at the forthcoming World Championships in Metz FRA this coming November.

The 2010 National Championships, scheduled for Birmingham in July will also include our Tumbling colleagues. The inclusion of this discipline will prove a spectacular addition to our annual event and one that we are all looking forward to.

News from the FIG indicates that the Time of Flight scheduled to be introduced in September of this year, will now happen on 1st January 2011.

FIG World Cup

Ghent BEL

07-11 April 2010

Ghent BEL was the host City for the first of the 2010 FIG World Cup series which will culminate with the final event of the year in the City of Salzgitter GER in October. Entries were rather smaller than usual for this opening World Cup of the year; and especially in the Tumbling event where only nine men and five women registered by the Nominative due date.

Great Britain was represented by a Men's and Women's Team in the Trampoline Competition, the majority of whom had also been selected for the European Championships in the town of Varna BUL some two weeks later. Unfortunately, prior to departure a number of changes had to be made to the Men's Team with the withdrawal of both Steven Williams and Jack Helme through injuries prior to departure. Daniel Greaves, who had been selected to participate in the synchronised event only was drafted in to the individual event, gaining his first Senior International Cap. A further withdrawal from the Men's Team occurred when Steven Walsh declared himself unfit to participate on arrival in Ghent. Not a great start to the World Cup Series for the GBR men.

Varna Bulgaria

17-25 April 2010

The British contingent returned from Varna at the end of a very traumatic journey by coach after the cancellation of flights out of the UK due to the volcanic ash problems throughout Europe which occurred prior to departure, having achieved a number of finals in all three disciplines at both Senior and Junior level, with the Tumbling Women pressing the Russians to take the Silver Medal in the Team event winning the first GBR Medal, followed closely by the Senior Women and Senior Men DMT Teams both taking Bronze Medals. The Junior TRA Girls then decided to get in on the act to end the first day of competition with the Bronze medal in their team event. An excellent first day of competition – then the medal haul got better and better each day thereafter. Results in the various disciplines, by event, were as follows:

The Volcanic European TRA, DMT & TUM Championships 2010

In years to come people all across the World disrupted by the cessation of air travel across Europe will remember what happened to them when the volcanic ash cloud descended.

For the GBR delegation to the 2010 European Championships in TRA, DMT & TUM the memory will be of a short notice dash to an eerily empty Terminal 3 at Heathrow from all over England, followed by a 3 night, 2 day coach journey across Europe, missing only two delegation members stranded in Malta and the North of Scotland.

Much debate in UEG and BG had taken place over the previous days and hours, to hold or not hold the Championships – they had to happen, to fly or not to fly – not possible, to go or not to go – not really an option once most Nations had declared their intent to be there. Thanks to those who worked behind the scenes to make it happen, we were on our way in a two coach convoy.

From all over Europe coaches (of the wheeled variety) were converging on Varna and seeming to have crossed the Danube on more than one occasion, the GBR delegation made its final approach thanks to relief coaches provided by the Bulgarian Federation when our drivers ran out of hours.

The official medal table is short one Team and one individual Gold medal for GBR – both for the longest individual journeys made, 57 hours for the team bus, 113 hours from me setting out from home.

Arriving throughout the 24 hours of Wednesday, most teams got one quick look at the venue and training slot, orientation and judges meetings were held and then after a night's rest, in very welcome beds, we were straight into an action packed condensed three day programme of competition.

DAY 1, TRA(I) Juniors, TRA(S) Seniors, DMT & TUM Seniors and their Team Finals.

For GBR the day meant achieving finalists in 5 of the 6 individual events we had competitors in, who would compete again on Saturday.

Moving into the evening with GBR having made it to the finals in all 5 groups we had teams in, TRA Junior boys & girls, DMT Men & Women and TUM Senior Women. Our team returned to the hotel proud of its achievements – a SILVER medal for our TUM women and BRONZE medals for both DMT teams and our TRA girls.

The Junior Trampoline individual qualifying rounds had also been the European selection event for the 2010 Youth Olympic Games. Our eligible GBR gymnasts did not make it on this occasion – watch out for surprise outstanding Greek gymnast Apostolos Koutavas in Singapore!

DAY 2, the turn of Junior DMT, TUM and TRA(S) and the Senior TRA(I).

This was a day of thrills and spills in the Senior event as the tiring journey and new 4x4mm beds took their toll on a large number of gymnasts, several of the GBR team included, while others displayed the magnificent height and amplification the new equipment allows. GBR's notable success was the qualification of Kat Driscoll for the TRA(I) Women's Final.

GBR's Junior DMT gymnasts used tactics to qualify for the Finals while saving their best passes for Saturday. In TUM GBR girls and boys took the competition to their corresponding Russian counterparts, with strong performances gaining high ranking places, showing promise for individual and team finals.

Three Junior teams entered and three qualifying for team finals, GBR finished day two off with a medal of each colour, GOLD for the TUM girls, SILVER for the TUM boys and BRONZE for the DMT girls. Special mention to all eight GBR female tumblers at the event – they have all now held a Junior European title.

Team of the day were the GBR Tumbling boys who had the tumbling world on the edge of their seats as they matched Russia pass by pass. Varying from 0.1 in front to equal, 0.1 in front, it all came down to the last pass and Russia pipped GBR to the post by just 0.1 (102.4, 102.3) for the Gold Medal, with other Nations' coaches saying it was the most exciting tumbling final they had ever seen.

DAY 3, big finals day for all our individual and synchro finalists – 5 GBR final places for TRA, 6 for TUM & 7 for DMT. One Senior DMT SILVER medal for Robyn Osborne and great success for our Juniors – Pamela Clark BRONZE TRA(I), Rhys Gray BRONZE DMT, Sapphire Dallard SILVER DMT, Lucie Colebeck, SILVER TUM and Shaun Gregory GOLD & European Junior Champion 2010 TUM.

Second in the Junior medal table (2 Gold 3 Silver, 4 Bronze) and 6th in the Senior Medal table (2 Silver, 2 Bronze), GBR came second in the medal table overall with 13 medals (1st RUS 30, 3rd BLR 9).

After a quick freshen up and a meal, all but six of the delegation loaded up their luggage, medals and memories of the event for the long journey home, waved off by those whose urgent commitments meant we had to fly home – after representing the GBR Team at the closing banquet.

Thanks to the quick thinking and decision making of the UEG in rearranging the programme, the supreme effort of the organisers to run a smooth condensed programme, the determination of the UEG Member Federations to get there and the resilience of youth, this is a European Championships everyone who took part will remember.

Coaching Update May 2010

The Trampoline Coaching Awards scheme has been developing over a 2 year period and the Level 3 has now been finalised and launched.

Between UKCC Level 2 and 3 there are 4 Technical modules.

Cycle 5/6 Coaches will need to attend a Technical update course to bring them to the same skill level as UKCC Level 2 Coaches before attending Technical modules. Update courses are now being advertised on the BG website.

The Level 3 Technical modules are 6 hours per module:

Module 1: 1 ¼ somersaults to and from body landings

Module 2: Twisting single somersaults and bailout rudi

Module 3: Training for competition and 1 ¾ front somersault

Module 4: Half out and double back somersaults

Courses are also available to Senior Club Coaches as CPD. These modules are now advertised on the BG website.

Candidates will need to be signed off as competent in teaching the skills. This may be completed as part of the module or alternatively, candidates may practise in their own clubs and then make their own arrangements with a Tutor or Technical expert to be signed off. Only signed off skills may be utilised by competitors in competition. The club is responsible for monitoring this.

The modules must be completed in sequence but candidates do not have to have all skills signed off before attending the next module.

The HPC coaching course will continue for at least 1 more year. There is a course in the SW in the summer and another is planned in the autumn in the Midlands area.

The Trampoline Tutors Conference will be held at Loughborough on September 11 & 12th 2010. This will include reviews of the UKCC Levels 1&2 plus other CPD issues.

Tutors are reminded that attendance at least once every 3 years is advised.

New Tutors

Any Level 2 UKCC Trampoline Coaches wanting to become new tutors should submit their CV's to their Regional Trampoline Committees. The Committees will recommend names to the Regional Committee for tutor training. Regions have received money from Gymnastics England to finance the training of new tutors. Following the UKCC training, the candidates will need to attend a Trampoline Specific Training Day before embarking on observing other tutors and practising delivery.

1st Youth Olympic Games - Singapore (SIN) 14-26 August 2010

While the countdown is on for the 1st Youth Olympic Games in Singapore, the qualification phase for the FIG's Olympic disciplines is now closed. The official drawing of lots for Artistic, Rhythmic and Trampoline Gymnastics competitions took place parallel to the FIG Council meeting in Chiba (JPN) on May 13, 2010.

The draw was conducted by the FIG Technical Committee Presidents for their respective disciplines, namely Adrian Stoica (ROU) for Men's Artistic, Nellie Kim (BLR) for Women's Artistic, Maria Szyskowska (POL) for Rhythmic and Horst Kunze (GER) for Trampoline Gymnastics.

A total of 150 Junior gymnasts will participate in the inaugural Youth Olympic Games, for which the majority qualified via their respective Junior Continental Championships between November 2009 and May 2010. In addition, one place in each category is reserved for the host country Singapore, and a defined number of National Olympic Committee (NOC) universality places are still to be granted.

Trampoline Gymnastics

Twelve boys and twelve girls will compete in Trampoline Gymnastics, 17 of whom qualified via their Continental Championships. Three universality places for boys and three places for girls will be allocated. One single place for both genders was originally reserved for the host country, but since no gymnasts from Singapore participated in the Continental Qualifying Event, which is mandatory for YOG participation, the unused quota place was allocated to the next eligible NOC from the same continent, in this case Japan.

Hence, the 18 places were obtained as follows:
